Sessions required: 2 (one-hour sessions each)

Objective: Learn about what Form is, create and understand what a three dimensional work of art is. Introduction to life and work of Georgia O'Keefe.



Materials required:

- 12x18 tagboard white
- 10x10 tagboard black
- 9x12 construction paper light green
- Tempera paint (pick 3 colors of your choice red, orange, purple)
- Tissue paper in various shades of green cut in squares
- brown packing paper cut in small circles.
- Black crepe paper cut in strips
- Brushes
- Clear tacky glue
- glue stick

Session 1:

- 1. Paint entire sheet of 12×18" heavyweight tagboard either red/ orange/ purple or a color of your choice using tempera paint. Put it aside to dry in the drying rack to work on it in the next session.
- 3. Fold the black crepe paper couple of times to make a rectangle of about an inch, cut the top in fringes to make the center of the flower.
- 4. To create the leaves, glue pre-cut squares of various shades of green tissue paper using glue stick on the 9x12 green construction paper. Allow them to dry for the next session.

Session 2:

- 1. Students draw several leaves shapes on the green construction paper using a sharpie and cut out their leaves. Attach leaves on the black tagboard using glue stick.
- 2. Using the template provided, have the students trace 4 petals of each size on the paper they painted with tempera on 1st session.

- 3. Once the tracing is done, have them cut out the petals starting with the large 4.
- 4. Show students under the document camera, how to stack the petals. Glue the slit of each petal to overlap slightly.
- 5. To assemble the flower, glue down all the large petals first, the edge of one petal right on top of each other to have a small overlap.
- 6. After applying glue and pressing the "tail" down for 5 seconds. This makes the petal stand up and pop out rather than lying flat.
- 7. Repeat the same process for small petals to and go around arranging them inside.
- 8. Attach the brown paper circle in the middle and then the black crepe paper fringe to the flower's center using clear tacky glue.
